



There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever."

Second Reading: A reading from the letter to the Hebrews (10:11-14, 19-25)

Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, "he sat down at the right hand of God," and since then has been waiting "until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet." For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.

Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.





The Rev. Ophelia Laughlin, Sermon Notes Sermon based on Mark 13:1-8

- 1. Gladiators, lions and the destruction of the Temple: Imagine the horror
- 2. Similar horrors today including the fall of the Twin Towers
- 3. Jesus: "Do you see these great buildings? Not 1 stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down."
- 4. Apocalyptic Scripture passages now seem relevant.
- 5. Jesus's motivation in announcing the coming destruction is 2 fold
- 6. First, to help prepare the people, "Do not be alarmed."
- 7. Secondly, to reassure them that it is the beginning and not the end, "This is but the beginning of the birth pangs."
- 8. Our God is the God of life, not death; creation, not destruction.
- 9. Nonetheless change of any kind is difficult and as a result many are anxious.
- 10. No wonder there is such polarization.
- 11. Followers of Jesus need not be afraid of change.
- 12. Our hope is in the God whose promises and power transcend worldly changes.
- 13 May our word and actions reflect our hope.
- 14. "When others hate, may you love.

When others curse, may you bless.

When others hurt, may you heal.

When others divide, may you unite.

When others rage, may you calm.

When others deny, may you affirm.

You are a servant of the light.

You need not be afraid of darkness.

God strengthen you to carry on with your work and faithfully live who you are in Christ: Love for stranger, love for enemy, love for neighbor. Amen.
